Full Spectrum Education is an education service company that empowers our students to reach their full potential through one-on-one, individualised, weekly sessions. Billing Information & Payments...

1. Weekly 2 hours via Teachworks Credit/Debit Card Payment – **\$178 + GST.**
2. **5% discount** on fees if payment is made upfront for the term or prorated (based on a 12-week term).

If the student is enrolled once the term has commenced the payment will be prorated (based on a 12-week term).

A \$25 administration fee applies if payment is declined. Suspension of service will occur if more than 2 payments are declined until the account is up to date.

If the student cannot attend the lesson for any reason, the lesson can be made up before the end of the term without penalty.

The Early Years Learning Framework...

Full Spectrum Education works closely with early years students across Australia, ensuring every session is grounded in the principles, practices and outcomes of the EYLF v2.0: Belonging, Being and Becoming. Our support model blends wellbeing, foundational skills development and relationship-centred teaching.

Our Approach to the EYLF Principles

Secure, respectful and reciprocal relationships

- Sessions always begin with emotional check-ins and predictable routines to build trust.
- Educators use warm, attuned interactions that support regulation, communication and connection.



Partnerships with families and schools

- Regular updates to teachers and parents.
- Collaborative goal setting based on current classroom data and teacher feedback.

High expectations and equity

- Lessons scaffold foundational literacy, numeracy and motor-skill pathways aligned with each child's developmental stage.
- Support plans are adjusted to meet individual needs, strengths and interests.

Respect for diversity

- Activities incorporate cultural responsiveness, inclusive practice and familiar contexts.
- Strength-based language guides all student interactions.

Ongoing learning and reflective practice

- Educators track progress each session in alignment with EYLF outcomes and the Australian Curriculum where applicable.
- Reflective notes help monitor social-emotional growth, engagement and learning behaviours.

Child Safe Standards...

We recognise our services count as a “child safe entity.” Here's how we embed the Standards and Universal Principle in our work with early years students:

Organisational Leadership & Culture **(Standard 1 – Leadership & Culture)**

- Child safety and wellbeing are embedded in our teaching, policies and everyday practice. Our leadership fosters a culture where safety, respect and open reporting are prioritised.
- Our educators and staff are trained and regularly supported to uphold these values, with clear, accessible lines for reporting concerns or feedback.



Voice of Children & Participation

(Standard 2 – Voice of Children)

- We actively create opportunities for children to express their views, concerns or preferences in sessions. We listen and respond to their input about what feels safe, comfortable and supportive.
- Children are supported to participate in decision-making about their learning and wellbeing where appropriate.

Family and Community Engagement

(Standard 3 – Family and Community)

- We maintain transparent and respectful communication with families and school partners.
- Families are encouraged to provide feedback, raise concerns or contribute to planning, helping ensure continuity and consistency between home, school and our sessions.

Equity, Diversity and Cultural Safety

(Standard 4 – Equity and Diversity + Universal Principle)

- We commit to cultural safety, especially for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and families. Our practices aim to make children feel welcome, included, valued, and respected.
- We tailor our approach to reflect each child's background, needs, identity and community context.

Complaints, Reporting & Response

(Standard 6 – Complaints Management)

- We maintain clear procedures for raising and responding to concerns or allegations of harm, misconduct or unsafe behaviour.
- Students, families and staff are given information about how to report concerns. All reports are taken seriously, documented and managed according to best practice and legal obligations.

Safe Physical & Online Environments

(Standard 8 – Physical & Online Environments)

- Where we conduct the sessions is physically safe, accessible, inclusive and age-appropriate.
- For any online or digital activities, we follow strict supervision, privacy, and data-security practices to ensure children's safety.

Continuous Improvement

(Standard 9 – Continuous Improvement)

- We regularly review and reflect on our practices, policies and outcomes. We monitor student wellbeing and safety, track feedback and make improvements where needed.
- Use of tools such as self-assessment, internal audits, and stakeholder feedback helps us stay proactive in safeguarding.

Policies, Procedures & Documentation

(Standard 10 – Policy and Procedures)

- We maintain comprehensive, written policies covering child safety, staff conduct, risk management, reporting, inclusion and cultural safety.
- These documents are accessible, regularly updated and aligned with QFCC guidelines and legislation.

Our Commitment to Cultural Safety.

We commit to:

- Creating welcoming, inclusive and respectful spaces for children from all cultural, linguistic and community backgrounds.
- Consulting with and involving Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, families and communities in decisions about safety, practice and environment.
- Recognising and addressing bias, discrimination or barriers proactively and ensuring every child feels valued, safe and able to thrive.



QLD Non-State Schools **Criteria...**

Our early years services are designed to align with the Non-State Schools Accreditation Board (NSSAB) requirements and support schools in meeting their compliance obligations.

Key Areas of Alignment

1. Educational Program & Curriculum Requirements

- All sessions align to the Australian Curriculum and EYLF principles.
- Learning goals, progress notes and evidence of engagement are documented.

2. Student Welfare and Support

- Behaviour, wellbeing and engagement strategies are intentionally embedded.
- Individual adjustments are made in collaboration with the school.

3. Qualified and Suitable Staff

- All staff hold relevant qualifications and undergo suitability checks.
- Blue Card compliance is maintained at all times.

4. Continuous Improvement & Monitoring

- Educators maintain session records, reflective notes and progress monitoring.
- Data can be provided to schools to support reporting.

5. Compliance with Child Protection Legislation

- FSE follows all mandatory reporting, safety planning and documentation requirements.

6. Safe, Inclusive and Supportive Learning Environments

- Sessions incorporate inclusive practice, differentiation and trauma-aware strategies.
- Environments prioritise physical, emotional and cultural safety.

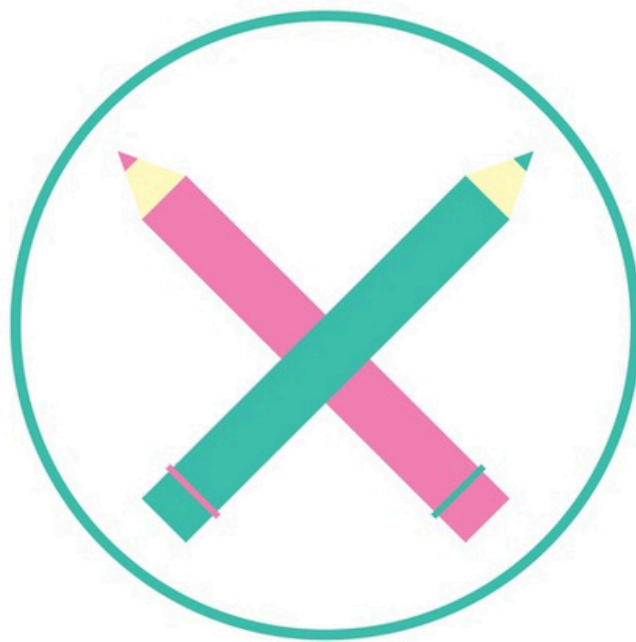
